Feedback of Meeting from Participants

- More time should be allowed for questions, clarifications, and contributions for subsequent learning meetings
- The meeting has created an enabling environment for learning, understanding and how QoC is implemented.
- The meeting is innovative and highly educative. However, refreshment should be improved upon
- It is observed that the meeting is very productive and impactful despite the timeline which is short
- Ondo State Model should be considered for other States as one of the best strategies
- There is need to engage more stakeholders such as local rulers, religious leaders, to assist in demand creation and improving community ownership
- It was a great meeting style with time management strictly adhered to. However, such meetings with sensitive discussion topics needs more for deliberation and learning sharing

- Communication between IPs should be improved upon
- Given the importance of QoC to the Universal Health Coverage, its imperative to understand how it is progressing at all levels. The breakfast meeting provided the opportunities for stakeholders to see the level we are as a nation
- The meeting was insightful especially the States experience sharing and the challenge to take up the mantle for sustainable development
- It will be interesting to read how the challenges identified are addressed and MCGL QoC to convey again
- For such important meetings, it will be nice to invite policy and decision makers
- Resolutions and recommendations from the meeting should be documented and challenged to the appropriate units for implementation
- Involve more States to share their experiences and also involve other MCGL projects
- Mondays are usually not the best days for such meetings. A breakfast meeting can be held for health care workers from learning facilities.
- Discussions should include QoC ownership and use of generated data.
- States should be encouraged to have regular information and knowledge sharing among health workers
